The video, published in 2001, focuses on the common challenges of rural areas in the Northern peripheral regions concerning the recruitment of women, especially young women, to settle and work there. The video uses case studies to show how women can successfully settle in the rural areas and through creativity and innovation use their competence, resources and the resources offered by the region to continue working either in the private or public sector.

The discussion focuses on the importance of women’s knowledge and competence with examples of successful strategies.
